

FATHI HABASHI

Professor emeritus of Extractive Metallurgy at Laval University in Quebec City, born in Al-Minia, Egypt on October 9, 1928. He holds a B.Sc. degree in Chemical Engineering from Fouad Al-Awwal University now the University of Cairo, a Dr. techn. degree in Inorganic Chemical Technology from the University of Technology in Vienna, and honorary degrees from the Technical University of Oruro in Bolivia and the Saint Petersburg Mining Institute in Russia. He is a Fellow of the Canadian Institute of Mining, Metallurgy, and Petroleum, and was holder of the Canadian Government Scholarship in Ottawa (1960-62). He taught at Montana School of Mines, worked at the Extractive Metallurgical Research Department of Anaconda Company in Tucson, Arizona before joining Laval in 1970. He was guest professor at a number of foreign universities, a guest lecturer at a number of institutions, and consultant to the United Nations Development Program for the Cuban Laterite Project. He authored *Principles of Extractive Metallurgy* in 4 volumes, a number of textbooks on metallurgy and history of metallurgy, and edited *Handbook of Extractive Metallurgy* in 4 volumes.

His research interests are inspired by a desire to develop an integrated understanding of extractive metallurgical processes and to put them into a systematic order within a historical background.
