Abstract to Tactical Silence in the Novels of Malika Mokeddem

Michel de Certeau's model of strategies and tactics, applied to a postcolonial assessment of both Algerian literature in French as well as Algerian women's stereotyped silence, has prompted this exploration of how the manipulation of silence may be used to challenge a gender-differentiated power system. This book considers the effect of practical silence on the lives of Malika Mokeddem's female protagonnists contained in the following novels: Les Hommes qui marchent (1990), Le Siècle des sauterelles (1992), L'Interdite (1993), Des Rêves et des assassins (1995), La Nuit de la lézarde (1998), N'zid (2001), La Transe des insoumis (2003), Mes hommes (2005), and Je dois tout à ton oubli (2008). The notion of deliberate silence also lends itself to a discussion of the reader's efforts in comprehending Mokeddem's textual silences and the author's decision to exclude certain topics from her writings.
