The University Librarian is responsible for managing all operations of the McMaster University Library and is a member of the Senior Management Team of the University. As a member of the Undergraduate and Graduate Councils the University Librarian is directly involved in discussions and decisions that impact academic programming at McMaster. The University Librarian is also Co-Chair of the Task Force on Teaching and Learning.

The McMaster University Library is comprised of three libraries occupying nearly 20% of the total campus including the Mills Library (Social Sciences/Humanities), the Innis Library (Business) and the Thode Library (Science/Engineering). A fourth library for health sciences reports directly to the Faculty of Health Sciences. McMaster University Library is a member of [CARL](#) (Canadian Association of Research Libraries) and currently ranks 94th on the Expenditure Index of [ARL](#) (Association of Research Libraries), up from 108<sup>th</sup> in 2006. McMaster participates in a number of consortial projects including [CRKN](#) (Canadian Research Knowledge Network), [OCUL](#) (Ontario Council of University Libraries) and [COAHL](#) (Consortium of Ontario Academic Health Libraries) for digital content. Together these consortial arrangements account for approximately 80% of our e-content. The combined collections of the libraries total more than 2 million volumes, 20,000 print and electronic journal titles, and more than 250,000 e-resources. Electronic books now account for approximately 10% of our total book content. McMaster currently ranks 2<sup>nd</sup> among the ARL institutions in percentage of acquisitions budget spent on electronic at nearly 75%. Total funding for the University Library is nearly \$17 million annually, up approximately 30% since 2006. Staffing currently stands at more than 110 full time employees.

The University Library also includes the William Ready Division of Archives and Special Collections. The diverse collections consist of culturally significant books and unique records of national and international scope: manuscripts such as a work of Boethius from the twelfth

century, a collection of 35,000 pre-1800 books with a concentration in the eighteenth century, and archives in literature, music, Canadian social history, peace and war, publishing, business, and labour. Of special note are the archives and library of the philosopher, social activist, and Nobel prize winner Bertrand Russell. More recent additions include the Brisebois Collection on the Holocaust and Resistance and the Jackie Washington Archives.

Additionally, the University Librarian at McMaster is also responsible for Classroom Audio-Visual Services, a staff of 10 audio-visual specialists supporting a wide variety of learning spaces on campus. Currently the department supports approximately 200 classrooms, lecture theaters and other non-traditional learning spaces. The University Library currently has two learning commons (Science/Engineering and Humanities/Social Sciences) a third is in early planning stages. The recent administrative and physical relocation of Lyons Multimedia Centre and the implementation of iTunes @ McMaster are enabling us to partner traditional library skills with multimedia development and delivery directly to the classroom.

The Wayne State University Library System is comprised of five libraries including the Adamany Undergraduate Library, Science and Engineering Library, Purdy/Kresge Library (humanities/social sciences), Shiffman Medical Library, and the Arthur Neef Law Library. The Library System also includes Library Computing & Media Services (providing instructional technology support to more than 300 classrooms), University Orientation, an ALA-accredited Library and Information Science Program, and Library Administrative Services.

The Library System is committed to national leadership in the transition of library collections from print to electronic resources and excellence in digital delivery of services. Currently, the Library System ranks first among ARL institutions in the percentage of its materials budget spent on electronic resources. The Library System is also a leader within the state of Michigan in the development of digital library initiatives; implementation of new electronic resources and services (Serials Solutions, ILLIAD, etc); implementation of an institutional repository; and is an active participant in the new and growing statewide online catalog.

Reporting directly to the Dean, the Associate Dean provides senior level leadership and oversight for library system operations; leads the advancement of excellence in customer service and process improvement; works with the Dean to translate the library vision and mission through development of innovative approaches to library services based on sound data and judgment and that meet the needs of customers; supports the Dean in interacting productively with the University administration and campus support units to advance the library system's role in advancing the urban mission of the University; assists with strategic and annual planning processes, including the formulation of system-wide and departmental goals and objectives and associated policies and procedures; leads library marketing and public relations; coordinates external programs and outreach to the urban community; provides senior level oversight to

LibQUAL+ and other assessment programs; assists in defining and articulating the library system's role in teaching and learning; leads library system efforts with development of the freshman experience.

This managerial position reports to the Associate Dean of the University Library System and is a member of the Library Leadership Team, the principal administrative body of the Library System. The Director of Library Computing and Media Services is responsible for the general administration of five distinct units including the Computer Support Team, Digital Library Services, Media Services, User Support Services, and Web Development Team. The combined staffing of these five units includes include 26 full-time librarians, IT professionals, AV Technicians and other support staff. While administratively this position falls within the University Library System organizational structure, it has campus-wide responsibility for the technology associated with more than 300 general purpose classrooms and for approximately 1000 desktop computers in the campus' general purpose computing labs.

In general, my responsibilities include strategic planning; coordination of project planning; prioritization and goal setting for IT related projects; analysis and report writing; purchasing and approving purchases of IT related items; development of policies, procedures, and documentation; grant writing and administration; and evaluation of IT-related user services.

Specifically,

- **Media Services** leads the campus community in applications of classroom technology and media resources. Working collaboratively with campus partners including CIT, OTL, FP&M, Public Safety, S/C/D's, and others, Media Services provides expertise and assistance in support of teaching, research, and service in over 300 different general purpose classrooms, auditoriums, lecture halls and meeting facilities; distance education and videoconferencing facilities; video production and post production services; visual and audio equipment rental; development and delivery of digital materials including streamed audio lectures; and presentation materials and support.
- **Computer Support Team (CST)** leads the campus community in the provision of general purpose computing facilities on campus. At Wayne State University the Library System is the only provider of general purpose computing facilities, including the only staffed 24-hour computing facility and the Advanced Computing stations for the colleges of Engineering and Liberal Arts & Science. The staff members on the CST provide support for more than 800 public computers, 200 staff computers and 30 servers within the Library System.
- **Digital Library Services** is primarily responsible for the Integrated Library System (currently Horizon but migrating to Innovative Interfaces Inc.). This team also works with campus partners to integrate the ILS and other services with Pipeline and Blackboard. The department is directly responsible for managing the integrated library system (Horizon) for the Wayne State University Library System (Adamany Undergraduate Library, Neef Law Library, Purdy/Kresge Library, Science and Engineering Library, Shiffman Medical Library,

Oakland Center Library, Pharmacy LRC, Library and Information Science Program, UGE1000, and University Media Services).

- **Web Development Team** is responsible for the management of the Library System's website (<http://www.lib.wayne.edu>), affiliated sites, and related resources. The Web Development Team facilitates the cooperative planning, implementation, and evaluation of content and applications for the Library System web site; the exchange of techniques and ideas relating to web development and design; the development of common goals for web site development; and the ongoing growth and refinement of the Library System's web site. In addition, the Web Development Team manages several partner websites including the Office for Teaching and Learning (<http://www.otl.wayne.edu/>); Detroit Community Aids Library (<http://www.lib.wayne.edu/dcal/>); Teaching, Learning and Technology Roundtable (<http://www.tltr.wayne.edu/>); and others. Staff members in this group are also responsible for creating, integrating, structuring, and ensuring access to digitized information services and resources that support teaching, learning, and research at WSU. Digital projects can be found at <http://digital.lib.wayne.edu/>. This unit receives funding from a variety of services including several active grants (<http://www.lib.wayne.edu/geninfo/about/grants/>).
- **User Support Services (USS)** leads the campus community in providing the only 24-hour general purpose computing help desk. Located in the Undergraduate Library, the USS help desk is the first point of contact for all computer-related assistance. USS works collaboratively with faculty and campus partners to provide access to nearly 20 closed labs for instructional use including loading specialized applications based on faculty requests. Currently USS provides support for ADA-related technologies installed in libraries.

As a founding member of OhioLINK, Wright State University Library System was one of the

first six institutions in Ohio to migrate to III. In this position I was actively involved in the development of OhioLINK from the earliest stages. Indeed, I was one of six “Lead Implementors” who were the first to design and implement the III system in Ohio.

Managed the integrated library system (OPAC, circulation, reserves, cataloging, acquisitions) for a cooperative consisting of the Wright State University Libraries (Paul L. Dunbar Library and Fordham Health Sciences Library), Educational Resource Center, Media Services, and Lake Campus. The cooperative also includes the following libraries in the Dayton metropolitan area: Children's Medical Center, Franciscan Medical Center, Good Samaritan Hospital, Grandview Medical Center, Kettering College of Medical Arts, Kettering Memorial Hospital, Miami Valley Hospital, Sycamore Medical Center, Veteran's Administration Medical Center. (The cooperative formerly included Dayton Art Institute, and the Dayton Museum of Natural History as well.)

Manage the Libraries' Information and Research Network – LIBNET, one of the first networks of its kind to integrate into a single web-based system all electronic resources including the online catalog; OhioLINK; cdrom databases and a variety of Internet resources; electronic services such as requests for online reference assistance, interlibrary loans, and renewals; and full text subscriptions.

Act as liaison between the affiliated libraries, the University Libraries, University Computing Services, University Disability Services, OhioLINK, and software and hardware suppliers. Supervise 3 FTE staff and 3 Student Aides.

In addition, for approximately 6 months during the same period I provided direct support for OhioLINK on a part-time basis, loading the first four research databases into the OhioLINK central system. In my role as “Interim Systems Administrator” I worked with Len Simutis, OhioLINK Project Manager; Sandy Westall, III Vice-President; UMI, the database vendor; and the OhioLINK Lead Implementors group to design and implement access to the first four online research databases licensed by OhioLINK.
