Appointed to Federal Advisory Committee on Juvenile Justice (FACJJ). Term: April 11, 2014 – present. Appointed by Administrator of the Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention (Current Administrator: Bob Listenbee, J.D.). The FACJJ was established by the Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention Act (Section 223) and supported by OJJDP. It is comprised of representatives from the nations State Advisory Groups (SAG). The FACJJ's role is to advise the President and Congress on matters related to juvenile justice, assist in evaluating the progress and accomplishments of juvenile justice activities and projects, and advise the Administrator of OJJDP regarding the work of OJJDP.

The JJDP offers guidance and funding to states in addressing juvenile justice issues (e.g., delinquency prevention, alternatives to detention, holding youth accountable for their actions, reducing Disproportionate Minority Contact, ensuring detained juveniles are held separately from adults). In Massachusetts the JJAC oversees these functions to help coordinate juvenile justice and delinquency prevention. The JJAC gives the Massachusetts Executive Office of Public Safety input in developing MA plans regarding delinquency prevention and overall child well-being and provides policy recommendations to the governor & state legislators on juvenile justice issues. and maintains awareness of State and Federal juvenile justice laws, the juvenile justice system, and juvenile facilities/programs.

Appointed Legislative Liaison to the Juvenile Justice and Child Welfare Section of the Massachusetts Bar Association. Term 9/1/13-9/1/14. The legislative liaison tracks juvenile legislation in the state of Massachusetts and serves as member of the Section Council to facilitate communication between the Section Council and the Office of General Counsel.
