SHORT BIOGRAPHY

Dr Matthew Rimmer is a Professor in Intellectual Property and Innovation Law at the Faculty of Business and Law, at the Queensland University of Technology (QUT). He has published widely on copyright law and information technology, patent law and biotechnology, access to medicines, plain packaging of tobacco products, intellectual property and climate change, Indigenous Intellectual Property, intellectual property and trade, and 3D printing regulation. He is undertaking research on intellectual property and sustainable development (including the debate over the right to repair); greenwashing; intellectual property, access to essential medicines, and public health (particularly looking at the COVID-19 crisis), and tobacco endgame policies. His work is archived at <u>QUT ePrints</u>, <u>SSRN Abstracts</u>, <u>Bepress Selected Works</u>, and <u>Open Science Framework</u>.

He has been particularly interested in the relationship between intellectual property and investorstate dispute settlement. He published a research monograph on The Trans-Pacific Partnership: Intellectual Property and Trade in the Pacific Rim (Edward Elgar, 2020-1). Rimmer has also been exploring other mega-regional trade agreements – such as the Regional Comprehensive Economic Partnership, the United States-Mexico-Canada Agreement 2020, and the Trade in Services Agreement.

Rimmer is a chief investigator of the NHMRC Centre of Research Excellence on Achieving the Tobacco Endgame (CREATE) (2020-2025). He is a co-director of the legal project of the research network. He is a researcher and commentator on the topic of intellectual property, public health, and tobacco control. He is the co-author of the influential article 'The Case for the Plain Packaging of Tobacco Products' (2008), which has been a high impact piece of research and public policy in Australia and the world.

The project examined how 3D printing disrupts copyright law, designs law, trade mark law, patent law and confidential information. The project sought to provide practical advice about intellectual property management and commercialisation, and boost Australia's capacity in advanced manufacturing and materials science. Along with Dinusha Mendis and Mark Lemley, Rimmer is the editor of the collection, *3D Printing and Beyond: Intellectual Property and Regulation* (Edward Elgar, 2019). He has also engaged in fieldwork on makerspaces, fab labs, tech shops, Maker Faires, and hackerspaces; and has been conducting interviews with members of the Maker Movement.

Rimmer has also considered the impact of the Trans-Pacific Partnership on access to essential medicines (IP Journal, 2017). Rimmer has been providing expert commentary on intellectual property, access to essential medicines, and the coronavirus COVID-19.

Rimmer is a chief investigator of the NHMRC Centre of Research Excellence on Achieving the Tobacco Endgame (CREATE) (2020-2025). He is a co-director of the legal project of the research network. Rimmer is a researcher and commentator on the topic of intellectual property, public health, and tobacco control. He is the co-author of the influential article 'The Case for the Plain Packaging of Tobacco Products' (2008), which has been a high impact piece of research and public policy in Australia and the world. Rimmer has undertaken research on intellectual property and the plain packaging of tobacco products, and given evidence to an Australian parliamentary inquiry on the topic. He has edited a special issue of the *QUT Law Review* on the topic, *The Plain Packaging of Tobacco Products* (2017). Rimmer has considered the development and implementation of the *WHO Framework Convention on Tobacco Control* 2003. He has been an advocate of tobacco control measures - such as tobacco advertising bans, graphic health warnings, plain packaging of tobacco products, tobacco divestment, and tobacco endgame strategies.

Rimmer has undertaken a range of research work and public policy engagement on the relationship between intellectual property, international trade, and globalisation. He has investigated the TRIPS Agreement 1994, and considered its implications for various global issues – such as technology transfer, food security, public health, and climate change. Rimmer has undertaken extensive analysis of the Australia-United States Free Trade Agreement 2004 – particularly focusing upon its impact upon the duration of the copyright term, and the evergreening of pharmaceutical drugs. He has also considered other bilateral trade agreements – such as the *Chile-Australia Free Trade Agreement*, the Korea-Australia Free Trade Agreement, the Japan-Australia Economic Partnership Agreement, and the China-Australia Free Trade Agreement. Rimmer was a critic of the Anti-Counterfeiting Trade Agreement 2011. Rimmer has written extensively about the various iterations of the Trans-Pacific Partnership. He has been particularly interested in the relationship between intellectual property and investorstate dispute settlement. He is publishing a research monograph on The Trans-Pacific Partnership: Intellectual Property and Trade in the Pacific Rim (Edward Elgar, 2020-1). Rimmer has also been exploring other mega-regional trade agreements – such as the Regional Comprehensive Economic Partnership, the United States-Mexico-Canada Agreement 2020, and the Trade in Services Agreement.

Rimmer was an Australian Research Council Future Fellow, working on Intellectual Property and Climate Change from 2011 to 2015. He is the author of a monograph, *Intellectual Property and Climate Change: Inventing Clean*

Technologies (Edward Elgar, September 2011). This book charts the patent landscapes and legal conflicts emerging in a range of fields of innovation – including renewable forms of energy, such as solar power, wind power, and geothermal energy; as well as biofuels, green chemistry, green vehicles, energy efficiency, and smart grids. As well as reviewing key international treaties, this book provides a detailed analysis of current trends in patent policy and administration in key nation states, and offers clear recommendations for law reform. It considers such options as technology transfer, compulsory licensing, public sector licensing, and patent pools; and analyses the development of Climate Innovation Centres, the Eco-Patent Commons, and environmental prizes, such as the L-Prize, the H-Prize, and the X-Prizes. Rimmer is the editor of the collection, *Intellectual Property and Clean Energy: The Paris Agreement and Climate Justice* (Springer, 2018). He is currently working on a manuscript, looking at green branding, trade mark law, and environmental activism. Rimmer is interested in the implementation of the *Paris Agreement* 2015 and the *United Nations Sustainable Development Goals* 2015.

Rimmer has also a research interest in Indigenous intellectual property and traditional knowledge. He has written about the misappropriation of Indigenous art, the right of resale, Indigenous performers' rights, authenticity marks, biopiracy, and population genetics. Rimmer is the editor of the collection, *Indigenous Intellectual Property: A Handbook of Contemporary Research* (Edward Elgar, 2015). He has focused upon the adoption and the implementation of the *United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples* 2007. Rimmer has participated in inquiries into the right of resale, inauthentic art, and the design of the Aboriginal Flag.

Rimmer was a Chief Investigator on an ARC Discovery Project on 'Inventing The Future: Intellectual Property and 3D Printing' (2017-2021). This project sought to provide guidance for industry and policy-makers about intellectual property, 3D printing, and innovation policy. It considered the evolution of 3D printing, and examine its implications for the creative industries, branding and marketing, manufacturing and robotics, clean technologies, health-care and the digital economy. The project examined how 3D printing disrupts copyright law, designs law, trade mark law, patent law and

confidential information. The project sought to provide practical advice about intellectual property management and commercialisation, and boost Australia's capacity in advanced manufacturing and materials science. Along with Dinusha Mendis and Mark Lemley, Rimmer is the editor of the collection, *3D Printing and Beyond: Intellectual Property and Regulation* (Edward Elgar, 2019). He has also engaged in fieldwork on makerspaces, fab labs, tech shops, Maker Faires, and hackerspaces; and has been conducting interviews with members of the Maker Movement.

In collaboration with Bita Amani and Caroline B. Ncube, Rimmer is the editor of *The Elgar Companion to Intellectual Property and the Sustainable Development Goals* (Edward Elgar, 2023).

Rimmer has supervised nine students who have completed Higher Degree Research projects on the topics, Secret Business and Business Secrets: The Hindmarsh Island Affair, Information Law, and the Public Sphere (2007); Intellectual Property and Applied Philosophy (2010); The Pharmacy of the Developing World: Indian Patent Law and Access to Essential Medicines (2012); Marine Bioprospecting: International Law, Indonesia and Sustainable Development (2014); Social Media Policies and Work: Reconciling Personal Autonomy Interests and Employer Risk (2017), copyright law and musical sampling (2017), True Tracks: Indigenous Cultural and Intellectual Property Principles for putting Self-Determination into Practice (2019), the Community-Based Patent Opposition Model in India (2020), and The Theft of Culture and Inauthentic Art and Craft Products: Australian Consumer Law, and Indigenous Intellectual Property (2020). Rimmer has also supervised sixty-nine Honours students, Summer Research Scholars, and Interns, and two graduate research unit Masters students. He is currently supervising a post-doctoral researcher working on intellectual property and 3D printing in the context of the coronavirus public health crisis.

He has also been an external assessor of thirteen candidates for higher degree research degrees – both in Australia (ACU, QUT, Murdoch University x 2, University of Canberra, the University of Tasmania x 2, UTS x 2, Charles Darwin University x 1)

and overseas (University of Helsinki, Hanken School of Economics, the University of Cape Town).

With a strong commitment to law reform and social justice, Rimmer has been an influential contributor to public policy debate in respect of intellectual property, innovation law, and international trade. He has made 89 submissions to a wide variety of public policy inquiries – both in Australia and overseas. Rimmer has given evidence in appearances before 31 public policy inquiries. His work has been cited in a wide range of government inquiries, public policy reports, and parliamentary debates. Rimmer's submissions have been cited by a broad cross section of political representatives – including by the Hon. Malcolm Turnbull from the Liberal Party, the Hon. Nicola Roxon from the Australian Labor, Senator Scott Ludlam from the Australian Greens, and Senator Nick Xenophon from the Nick Xenophon Team. Rimmer received the ANU Vice-Chancellor's Award for Public Policy and Outreach at the annual Awards Ceremony on the 26 November 2013. He was one of Managing IP's 50 most influential intellectual property people in 2014.

Rimmer has been a high-profile contributor to media discussion relating to intellectual property, innovation law, and international trade. He has made 799 media contributions, featuring in television, radio, newspapers, and online media. Rimmer has discussed trade agreements on *Lateline*. Rimmer received a Social Media Award from the ANU in 2014, and was named one of the Top 100 Eco-Influencers by Corporate Knights in 2015.

Rimmer has been an external assessor in a number of grant processes – including for the Australian Research Council, the Bank of Sweden Tercentenary Foundation, the Canada Research Chairs, Canada's Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council, the Gerda Henkel Foundation for the Marie Curie Fellowship, the Hong Kong Research Grants Council, the Netherlands Organisation for Scientific Research (NWO), the Royal Society of Canada, and the United States National Science Foundation. He has been an external assessor for a number of monograph and publishing proposals. As well as serving an appointment boards for internal candidates and appointments, he has been an external assessor for a number of promotion applications for Australian and Canadian universities.

Abstract:

As part of the QUT Edge Grant, Dr Muhammad Zaheer Abbas will focus on the potential of 3D printing in addressing the current global health crisis and possible challenges posed by the current intellectual property regime during the pandemic.

COVID-19 has already caused far-reaching negative impacts not only on health but also on the social and economic well-being of the global population. Lockdowns, travel restrictions, quarantines, social distancing, and other strict public-health measures have played their part in minimizing the spread of infection, but governments are desperate for a safe and potent vaccine, effective therapeutics, point-of-care diagnostics, and other health products to combat this pandemic. Given the global nature of this health crisis, any delay in the advancement of vaccines and needed medical technologies may have serious economic, social, psychological, political, and legal implications.

3D printing offers promise in relation to the provision of health technologies designed to address COVID-19. Additive manufacturing is uniquely well positioned to support the shortage of critical medical devices. A wide range of medical devices can be customized and printed in a timely and cost-effective manner by using additive manufacturing techniques. This breakthrough technology allows the rapid conversion of information from digital 3D models into physical objects. This rapid prototyping technology can be used to scale up the manufacturing of hospital respiratory support apparatus like ventilators. Likewise, 3D printing can be used to mitigate shortages of personal protective equipment like face shields, respirator hoods, and surgical masks. Governments around the world need to make sure that intellectual property rights do not become a hurdle in using the full potential of 3D printing in response to disruptions to the medical product supply chain in the pandemic context. The aim of regulating 3D printing of COVID-19 related health technologies should be to ensure consistent quality and reproducibility in large-scale manufacturing and supply of critical medical devices.

This study is crucial because access to necessary health technologies in a pandemic context is a matter of life and death for millions of patients around the globe, especially for underprivileged patients in resource-constrained countries. 3D printing can be used as a force for good in public health in these trying times. This study will help policy makers at national and international levels by contributing to the debate over intellectual property and scope of 3D printing in response to the global health crisis. In particular, this research will address some of the intellectual property flexibilities in respect of the COVID-19 technologies – including the ACT-Accelerator, CTAP, patent pools, patent pledges, public sector licensing, compulsory licensing, and models of open innovation.

This use of the QUT Edge Grant will help with the production of further research and public policy work in the pipeline coming out of the ARC Discovery Grant on intellectual property and 3D printing, and enable further funding applications in 2021-2022 in respect of intellectual property and advance manufacturing – particularly in light of public health challenges such as COVID-19.

Summary: There has been a long-standing debate over whether medical diagnostics should be patentable subject matter. This has been crystallized with the recent controversy over Myriad Genetics relying upon patents in respect of genetic testing of breast cancer. The company applied for patents on the discovery, including a 'composition-of matter' patent on the gene itself and a 'method-of-use' patent for the application of BRCA 1 and BRCA 2 in the diagnostic and therapeutic arena. In response, there has been a world-wide protest against the breadth of the patents held by Myriad Genetics in respect of genetic tests for breast cancer. There have been doubts expressed about the validity of the patents. There have also been concerns raised about the implications of the patents for the administration of health care.







3D printing, Bioprinting, and additive manufacturing promise to revolutionise healthcare, medicine, and surgery. There have been high hopes that the field will

result in the next industrial revolution. Governments have invested in makerspaces, fab labs, incubators, and accelerators in order to encourage innovation in the area. Nonetheless, this disruptive technology poses a range of legal, ethical, and regulatory challenges. There has been a debate about the regulation of 3D printing by food and health regulators. There has been emerging conflicts in the field of intellectual property over 3D printing, bioprinting, and additive manufacturing. Moreover, there have been larger issues in respect of product liability and 3D printing. 3D printing raises larger questions about the relationship between creativity, art,

design, and science. There has been much interest in the role of 3D printing in education. 3D printing and bioprinting have also featured in popular culture – from Westworld to Ghost in the Shell.

This research workshop brings together an interdisciplinary range of researchers from science, law, geography, history and art to consider the various dimensions of bioprinting. The event hopes to raise public policy questions about the regulation of 3D printing, bioprinting, and additive manufacturing. The event will provide practical recommendations about intellectual property management and regulation to bioprinting researchers, scientists, and engineers.



Climate Change, Capitalism and Corporations

Please join members of the Intellectual Property and Innovation Law Research Program for a half-day workshop.

This event is a research workshop focused upon the role of corporations in respect of climate change. The various speakers will consider how managers and corporations interpret and respond to the climate crisis. Professor Christopher Wright from the University of Sydney will give a keynote speech on the 'Climate Crisis, Corporate Imaginaries and Creative Self-Destruction'. The four panellists will consider the role of business in climate action from a variety of disciplinary perspectives – including law, business, regulation, and the environment.

Angela is a Vice Chancellor's Research Fellow in QUT's Faculty of Law and a research associate in the Tilburg Institute for Law, Technology and Society (Netherlands). She is a comparative socio-legal scholar of technology and is the author of Socio-Legal Aspects of the 3D Printing Revolution (Palgrave 2016) and Private Power, Online Information Flows and EU Law: Mind the Gap (Hart 2016). She holds a PhD in Law from the European University Institute, which was joint winner of the 2013-2015 Fondazione Calamandrei Frosini prize for best thesis in legal informatics and information law. Prior to QUT, she was previously Postdoctoral Research Fellow in Media and Communications Law at the Swinburne Institute for Social Research.

Climate crisis, corporate imaginaries and creative self-destruction

Abstract: In the space of two centuries of industrialization, humanity's embrace of fossil fuel energy has changed the very chemistry of the atmosphere and oceans with profound consequences. We now face a grim future; large tracts of the Earth rendered uninhabitable, the collapse of global food production, the acidification of the oceans, substantial sea-level rise and storms and droughts of growing intensity. So how has it come to this? How to paraphrase Elizabeth Kolbert, has a technologically advanced society chosen in essence to destroy itself? In this presentation I argue that the particular neoliberal variant of late capitalism that now dominates global political-economy not only obfuscates the need for a fundamental questioning of the capitalist imaginary of endless growth and resource exploitation, but exacerbates the problem by framing business and markets as the only means of responding to the crisis. In essence, the prevailing political view is that capitalism is not a cause of climate change but as an answer to it. In particular, the presentation will focus on three core imaginaries that underpin our creative self-destruction: 'business as usual', 'green business' and 'natural capitalism'. The presentation will explore the key dimensions of these founding belief systems, as well as alternative imaginaries that are likely to emerge as the climate crisis worsens.

Dr Nicole Rogers

Climate change does not play by the rules. As Robyn Kundis Craig has observed, 'climate change is the trickster of the 21st century.' 1 Timothy Morton emphasises its 'uncanny' nature. **Abstract:** What paths, therefore, should researchers pursue in order to undertake research into climate change? While scientific investigation into climate change impacts and research into technological and regulatory partial fixes are clearly important, other sorts of research are also critical if we are to come to terms with climate change as trickster: big picture interdisciplinary research which does not necessarily have any political or commercial value in the knowledge economy.

In this paper, drawing upon Margaret Thornton's work on the corporatised university, the renegade scientists and utopian visionaries in Margaret Atwood's Maddaddam trilogy and the walkaway researchers in Cory Doctorow's latest novel, I shall reflect upon the possibilities for creative rule-bending research into climate change as trickster within the constraints of contemporary Australian corporatised academia.

Dr Michelle Maloney

Alternative economic imaginaries - too little too late? The New Economy Network Australia

Abstract: "You never change things by fighting the existing reality. To change something, build a new model that makes the existing model obsolete" -R. Buckminster Fuller

If we turn our attention away from the towering steel and concrete, the pollution and the plastic, the sheer violence and noise of contemporary consumer capitalism, and steady our gaze on the quieter spaces – the spaces between the towers and beyond the noise - we can find a prolific blossoming of alternatives to the current capitalist crises. Solar farms, community gardens, democratic social enterprises, urban agriculture, community currencies, platform cooperativism, peer-to-peer support, First Nations community driven sovereignty and economic initiatives, land restoration cooperatives, wildlife protection projects, aquaculture farms nurturing heat resilient coral for a climate changed world ... the list goes on.

It is arguable that one of the most important challenges of our time, in this second decade of the 21st Century, is to connect, amplify and strengthen the already diverse elements of the 'alternative economy', so that it no longer grows in the shadows and the quiet places, but can replace the destruction of the material and intellectual legacy of industrialization and hyper-consumer-capitalism. The New Economy Network

Australia (NENA) was created in late 2016 by around 100 individuals and organisations who see the amplification and strengthening of 'alternative' economic approaches as an important way to challenge the current system and create a sustainable, livable future. NENA is 'under construction' and in this paper I'll give an overview of what it is, why it was created and what its plans to do.

Professor Matthew Rimmer

Greenwashing: Trademark Law, Consumer Rights and Internet Domain Names Abstract: Greenwashing is a pernicious problem, which involves misleading and deceptive representations by corporations in respect of the environment. There are a number of legal responses – spanning trade mark law, consumer rights, and internet domain names.

First, this paper considers the role of trade mark law in respect of green branding, environmental messaging, and greenwashing. It considers the action of the United States Patent Trade Mark Office in respect of 'green' trade mark applications, which have been descriptive, generic, and misleading. It also examines the response of IP Australia and the High Court of Australia to trade mark applications in respect of the colour 'Green'. It also highlights the use of certification trade marks to promote credible and authentic eco-labels – such as the Nordic Swan EcoLabel, the Wind-Made Label developed by Vestas and Bloomberg, and the Carbon Trust's Carbon Footprint.

Second, this paper examines the role of consumer regulators in regulating greenwashing, carbon scams, and astroturfing. The Federal Trade Commission in the United States has issued revised 'Green Guides' to tackle the problem of greenwashing. There has been a striking complaint by Forest Ethics against the Sustainable Forestry Initiative. The ACCC has also developed guidelines in respect of green marketing, and has taken action on occasion. The Advertising Standards Authority in the United Kingdom has also been active in addressing false and misleading advertising.

Third, this paper examines the role of Internet Domain Names in respect of

environmental communication. It provides a case study of the successful bid by Big Room in respect of the Dot Eco application.

Dr Hope Johnson

Intellectual Property, Climate Change, and Food Security

Abstract: It is estimated that almost 1 billion people in the world are food insecure. These people are primarily rural smallholders in the developing world. The causes of structural food insecurity are complex and inter-related. Amongst them are(i) the expansion of intellectual property rights, which has disrupted traditional farming practices, the development of (ii) export orientation in food production, (iii) rural poverty, (iv) land grabs and now (v) climate change. The impact of climate change on food insecurity is two-fold. Firstly, the availability of arable land will reduce as the climate declines. Secondly, some states have begun positioning themselves for this scenario by buying up agricultural land in the developing world. Both of these factors will only heighten food insecurity in the developing world. A coordinated global response is required to safeguard the livelihoods and welfare of the food insecure. This must involve a reassessment of the legal framework within which food security has been allowed to become imperilled.

Title: The 'Third Industrial Revolution' 3D Printing Technology and Australian Designs Law

Abstract: Three-dimensional (3D) printing and scanning, touted as the next disruptive technology, is already upon us. Merging the physical and digital, 3D printing and scanning is having profound effects on how we design, share, copy and manufacture objects. Consequently, this article considers the previously unexplored intellectual

property implications for registered design owners. In doing so, it examines the technological background to 3D printing and scanning against a backdrop of consumer access to these technologies. With the advent of 3D scanners and 3D printers any user can (re)produce unauthorised versions of an object that embodies a registered design in digital or physical form. This article considers the effectiveness of Australian registered design rights to combat infringement of this kind. It is concluded that the Designs Act 2003 (Cth) is unable to deal with this nascent technology.

Professor Margaret Maile Petty.

Title: A Moment of Truth: 3D technologies and the future [or obsolescence] of design

Abstract: Contemporary design has its origins in the first third of the twentieth century, with the blossoming of mass manufacture and the rise of consumer culture and economics, when the re-styling of a refrigerator could triple sales within one financial year. Today such exhilarating sales curves are harder won. However many UX designers a company employs, the notion of creating a singular 'killer product' that can be produced in the millions is increasingly challenged by cross-sector disruptions such as 3D printing and scanning in combination with the escalating sophistication and use of AI and big data. The allied design disciplines have a small window of opportunity to consider what design means in the 4th industrial revolution, where does it add value, and how can it adapt to radically different forms of manufacture, supply chains, IP protections and customer demands for greater levels of customization. 'A Moment of Truth' will briefly explore these drivers in the relation to the larger evolution of design since the 1930s and pose critical questions central to defining the future or future obsolescence of design.

Daniel Flood

Title: Misconceptions of Legality: 3D printing and community

Abstract: 'Just because someone can' does not mean they should but Australians have proven to be culturally ambivalent to this reality where it intersects with the legality. This is clearly evidenced by the published numbers of Australian illegal downloads of Game of Thrones. Mashup and remix culture reflect a frontier attitude to copyright that is pervasive and can be evidenced through a simple Google search.

At large the community does not truly understand the legal realities, citing fair use or a general ambivalence towards their actions. This is compounded by the implements of making - including 3D design and printing - being so readily available at an affordable price point, easily accessible in public places like libraries and makerspaces. Further, the current cultural movements of repair cafes and DIY encourages communities to repair their own equipment, designing replacement parts using 3D printers that are, at their core, protected intellectual property. In essence breaking the law.

Conversely, with this consumer equipment and increasingly powerful tools for design is establishing a new class of designers that lack a learned, embodied understanding regards intellectual property law, moral rights and licensing, the misuse of copyright and alternate licensing platforms (Creative Commons, GPL etcetera) in their work in common, negating the protections they offer and exposing individuals to be either taken advantage of or finding themselves in breach of those same licenses. Misconceptions of Legality will explore the understanding and misconceptions in the general community around intellectual property and 3D printing, and the role spaces such as libraries, public makerspaces (etc) can and do play in informing this conversation in community.

Dr Brett Dale

Title: Opportunity knocks - 3D printing will revolutionise the automotive industry!

Abstract: Business has been aware of 3D printing and the expectation it will revolutionise the automotive industry. However, the technology is still considered to be on the periphery and only recognised by *innovators* as a disruptor to both the manufacturing sector and the retail, service and repair sector of the automotive industry. Latest developments suggest that 3D printing is preparing to turn manufacturing on its head, with 3D metal printing systems that are much faster, safer and cheaper than existing systems and now capable of competing with traditional mass manufacturing processes. The hype is real with new technology enabling 3D printing up to 100 times

faster, with 10 times cheaper initial costs and 20 times cheaper materials costs than existing laser technologies may be tipping point for large scale 3D manufacturing of car components. Latest technology provides rapid, cheap metal prototyping for engineering groups, and a production system for mass manufacturing. Indeed, 3D printing is likely to disrupt both manufacturing and retail service and repair sectors of industry.

The entire automotive value chain will be transformed by emerging technologies, such as 3D printing in 2-5 years. Specifically, 3D printing will disrupt our parts suppliers, our vehicle body sector, tools and servicing and eventually the car manufacturing sector itself. Industry must maintain the leadership and momentum on digital disruption and emerging technologies, which according to experts will impact business by 2020 with the major rollout and effect here by 2022. In the context of a timeframe, it is closer than many realise! Real opportunities will be gained by preparing business for the digital and technological transformations. The key to success will be open collaboration with stakeholders and regulators about emerging technologies to ensure that associated regulations are responsive, flexible and support business prosperity and consumer expectations.

Dr Angela Daly

Title: 3D printing and designs in China

Abstract: This presentation provides an introduction to the 3D printing ecosystem in China, with a focus on file-sharing sites, makerspaces and some of the emerging IP law considerations there. China has been investing large sums in innovative technologies including 3D printing, and is transitioning from a 'user' of others' IP to a creator and producer country in its own right. As with the Internet, a different linguistic, political and cultural context has given rise to a different 3DP ecosystem compared to the Western world. However, our initial research suggests similar concerns are arising as regards the relationship between 3D printing, design files and IP. The work-in-progress in this presentation comprises exploratory research conducted as part of the UK Intellectual Property Office-funded project, 3D Printing and IP Law Futures, in advance of our horizon scanning workshop to be held in Shenzhen in September 2017.

Professor Matthew Rimmer

Title: Bring It On: The Supreme Court of the United States, Copyright Law, Designs, Fashion, and 3D Printing

Abstract: The Supreme Court of the United States granted leave to consider the vexed question of copyright protection in respect of fashion. In the case of Star Athletica v. Varsity Brands, a number of 3D printing companies have filed a brief to establish a test for determining conceptual separability under copyright law. The companies involved include Formlabs Inc., Matter and Form Inc., and Shapeways Inc. In many ways, this dispute focuses upon legal issues thrown up by the controversy over Left Shark. The submission noted: 'This case presents a clear conflict among the circuits on an important substantive matter of copyright law that justifies this Court's review'.

The submission warned: 'These advancements are threatened by the current fractured state of copyright law on objects combining functional and artistic elements.' The 3D companies were concerned: 'Uncertainty over the line between copyrightable and noncopyrightable works can lead to over-claiming and over-categorization of material as copyrightable, upsetting the balance struck by Congress between the interests of rights holders and the societal benefits from a vibrant public domain.' The industry pleaded with the Supreme Court of the United States: 'This Court should grant certiorari to resolve the present circuit split and ensure that the development of innovative technologies and industries such as 3D printing is not hampered by the ongoing conflicts and confusion in conceptual separability doctrine'. There was a powerful joint submission led by Public Knowledge on the topic of intellectual property and 3D printing. Charles Duan from Public Knowledge highlighted the larger ramifications of the dispute for fashion, designs, and 3D printing hobbyists.

On the 22nd March 2017, the Supreme Court of the United States delivered a majority 6-2 opinion in favour of the respondents Varsity Brands, Inc. against Star Athletica LLC. Thomas J delivered the opinion of the court, in which Roberts CJ, Alito J, Sotomayor J, and Kagan J joined. Ginsburg J filed a concurrence. Breyer J filed a dissenting opinion, which Kennedy J joined. Writing for the majority, Thomas J observed: 'Congress has provided copyright protection for original works of art, but not for industrial designs'. His Honour noted: 'The line between art and industrial design, however, is often difficult to draw. 'We hold that an artistic feature of the design

of a useful article is eligible for copyright protection if the feature (1) can be perceived as a two- or three-dimensional work of art separate from the useful article and (2) would qualify as a protectable pictorial, graphic, or sculptural work either on its own or in some other medium if imagined separately from the useful article.' Thomas J found that the test was satisfied in this case involving the surface of cheerleading uniforms. In her concurrence, Ginsburg J held that 'the designs are themselves copyrightable pictorial or graphic works reproduced on useful articles.'

In dissent, Breyer J disagreed that the designs that Varsity Brands Inc. submitted to the Copyright Office would be eligible for copyright protection. His Honour emphasized that there was a need to respect the decisions of Congress in respect of the scope of copyright protection: 'The Constitution grants Congress primary responsibility for assessing comparative costs and benefits and drawing copyright's statutory lines. Courts must respect those lines and not grant copyright protection where Congress has decided not to do so. And it is clear that Congress has not extended broad copyright protection to the fashion design industry.' The judge observed: 'I fear that, in looking past the three-dimensional design inherent in Varsity's claim by treating it as if it were no more than a design for a bolt of cloth, the majority has lost sight of its own important limiting principle.'

The decision attracted a wide array of public commentary. There has been disquiet about the impact of the Supreme Court of the United States decision on 3D printing. The presentation will consider the ramifications of the ruling for copyright law, designs, fashion and 3D printing.

RoboCops in the frontline: Robotronica sorts fact from fiction

Brad Wright has been a police officer for more than three decades and has led the introduction and use of drones and other human-operated robotic technology in the Queensland Police Service (QPS) over the past eight years.

While he's witnessed firsthand technology's rapid evolution and application, Acting Superintendent Wright (pictured) doesn't expect to see himself or his colleagues replaced by a 'RoboCop' any time soon – even with reports of the first experimental robotic police officer now patrolling the streets of Dubai and a plan to have unarmed robots make up 25 percent of that city's patrolling force by 2030.

"I think we are still quite a few steps away from police being replaced by machines that are autonomously making decisions and applying force," he said.

Acting Superintendent Wright will join a panel discussion at QUT's Robotronica on Sunday (August 20), *RoboCop: Robots, Ethics, and Law Enforcement*, to examine the ethical debate and implications of using remote-controlled, semi-autonomous and fully autonomous robots as law enforcers.

Chaired by QUT Professor in Intellectual Property and Innovation Law Matthew Rimmer, the session will also hear from Dr Monique Mann from QUT's School of Justice (pictured below) and applied robotics engineer Associate Professor James Mullins from Deakin University.

Acting Superintendent Wright said the QPS was the first police service in Australasia to introduce drones (remotely piloted aircraft) in late 2013, with one used at a home invasion and subsequent siege in the Brisbane suburb of Banyo in which a woman and her teenage daughter were held hostage.

Since then, the technology had advanced considerably and drones were now being used by QPS Special Emergency Response Team (SERT), Forensic Services, and were being looked at as a tool during serious road traffic crashes, he said.

"The first drone we had which was purpose built for our use had only six minutes of operational flight time," he said.

"Now drones that are commercially available off the shelf have 40 minutes' flight time, thermal imaging, high-definition and encrypted video streaming as standard.

"We have always been conscious and careful with the introduction of these technologies that there are community concerns around issues of privacy and safety. Our focus has been on air safety and their use in open and overt ways."

Dr Mann said lawmakers need to keep pace with rapid technology developments being implemented in policing around the world – including autonomous 'RoboCops', facial recognition and other automated systems of surveillance, and softbots such as a computer-generated children used to lure online predators.

"The social, legal and ethical issues around these are complex, but the regulatory tipping point for automated robotic policing has certainly passed," she said.


"Priority areas requiring attention and regulatory measures include legal frameworks around robot use of force, processes to ensure the transparency of automated decisionmaking, consideration of how criminal law is converted into algorithms and the admissibility of softbot-procured evidence in criminal trials.

"These are issues that need to be tackled now."


What are the legal, ethical and societal issues if humans form intimate relationships with robots as the recent films such as Ex Machina and TV shows such as Westworld have represented?

Topic: Parallel tracks? The national relationship between intellectual property and climate change

Professor Abbe Brown:

University of Aberdeen, Scotland. Dr Abbe E. L. Brown is a legal researcher and teacher at the University of Aberdeen in Scotland. From 1 August 2017 she will be a Personal Chair. Abbe's main research interest is the laws relating to intellectual property and innovation, their intersection with other legal fields, and the impact of this on key societal challenges. Key publications are Intellectual Property, Human Rights and Competition: Access to Essential Innovation and Technology (Edward

Elgar 2012), the edited collection Environmental Technologies, Intellectual Property and Climate Change (Edward Elgar 2013) and several editions of the respected OUP textbook Contemporary Intellectual Property: Law and Policy. Funding sources for her research include the Modern Law Review, the UK Arts and Humanities Research Council, the Carnegie Trust for the Universities of Scotland and the Wellcome Trust. Before returning to academia, Abbe practised as a solicitor specialising in intellectual property, competition (including ACCC v Boral) and commercial litigation in London, Melbourne and Edinburgh. Abbe's current projects involve intellectual property, climate change and technology; intellectual property, disability and personhood; and with Professor Charlotte Waelde a forthcoming edited collection Intellectual Property and the Creative Industries. In July and August 2017 she is spending time in Australia working on her forthcoming monograph Intellectual Property, Climate Change and Technology: managing national legal intersections, relationships and conflicts.

Abstract:

Climate change has been recognised through international agreements, most recently the Paris Agreement, as a key problem of contemporary society. Technology and its role in dissemination and sharing is one means of addressing this, as can be seen for example from the increasing importance accorded to the United Nations Framework on Climate Change's Technology Mechanism. The fact that technologies may be the subject of intellectual property rights, held in private hands, receives limited attention in climate change negotiations and certainly in final form documents. The problems arising from this have been explored by scholars (Rimmer, Barton) as have arguments that issues could be addressed through taking new approaches to the fragmentation of international law and to treaty interpretation (Frankel, Young, Grosse-Ruse Khan).

Yet the relationship between climate change, technology and intellectual property is actually taking place at a national level, and this issue is underexplored. The paper being discussed in this presentation forms part of a book project addressing this, taking the UK jurisdictions as an example. Reference will be made to UK intellectual property legislation and its limited engagement with climate change; and to climate

change legislation from Westminster and from Holyrood which imposes obligations on states and on public authorities to meet targets, to report on actions taken and to have regard to technology when setting targets and budgets and when making energy efficiency and low carbon plans. A strong policy theme in Scotland and at UK level is to encourage developing a variety of technologies rather than to be dependent upon one. Yet policy and legislation are silent about the potential for the impact of IP.

Drawing on this framework, this presentation will present a hypothetical case study drawing from actual events. It will discuss the potential for conflict, for court adjudication and for new judicial approaches; and will make some preliminary suggestions for new court based relationships between intellectual property, technology and climate change which would be of transnational relevance.

Abstract: The emergence of very large transnational private companies which provide critical Internet infrastructure and services has brought with it corresponding concerns about the power of these companies to control, surveil and otherwise influence our communications. Many of these companies also gather vast amounts of data by, and about their users – a bank of data which has proved attractive to the public power of nation-states' security and law enforcement agencies, which have accessed it in less than transparent and legitimate ways, as Edward Snowden's revelations from 2013 attest.

Against this backdrop, this event considers how different jurisdictions' legal, regulatory and policy frameworks, including antitrust/competition, sector-specific regulation and human/constitutional rights have been addressing digital dominance issues. Some key topics, including net neutrality in the US & EU, the competition investigations into Google and the emergence of cloud computing, will be covered in order to determine how well existing legal systems are able to protect individual Internet users' interests vis-à-vis private power online.



The year 2016 marks an 'Anzac' anniversary of a different kind: the centenary of legal regulation over use of the term 'Anzac' in Australia and internationally. In Anzac: The Landing, The Legend, The Law, Catherine Bond interrogates the legal history of one of Australia and New Zealand's most revered words and the restrictions on the acronym that still exist today.

This book examines how, in 1916, control of 'Anzac' was introduced initially for businesses then extended, without precedent, to more private spheres, including prohibiting the use of the word as the name of a home. It documents the effect that these laws had on the Australian home front and the devastating impact on soldiers and families. Yet, such use and regulation was not limited to Australia, with New Zealand, the United Kingdom and the United States authorities also grappling with how to respond to the increased adoption of 'Anzac' within their borders. Bond explores these issues and how this legal history can be used to inform the restrictions on 'Anzac' that remain in force in Australia to this day.

Anzac: The Landing, The Legend, The Law will appeal to all readers with an interest in law or history, and those keen to understand more about a forgotten aspect of the 'Anzac' legend.

Dr Catherine Bond

Catherine is a Senior Lecturer in the Faculty of Law, UNSW Sydney. She completed her PhD in Law at UNSW and became an academic member of the Faculty in July 2009. Catherine teaches and researches in intellectual property law, with a focus on historical IP issues. She has published widely in leading Australian and international law journals, on issues ranging from Crown copyright to the introduction of a patent system in the Game of Thrones world of Westeros. Her first book, Anzac: The Landing, The Legend, The Law, is part of her recent work on the relationship between IP and war, from World War I through to today.

15 February 2017 - Forum on Access to Essential Medicines

Access to Medicines This forum was hosted by the QUT Intellectual Property and Innovation Law Research Program and the Australian Centre for Health Law Research in the QUT Faculty of Law to coincide with the visit of the Hon. Michael Kirby to the QUT Faculty of Law. It assessed and evaluated the recommendations of the United Nations Secretary-General's High Level Panel on Access to Medicines. Access to medicines is a critical issue in respect of infectious diseases, such as HIV/AIDS, malaria, tuberculosis, the SARS virus, Ebola, and the Zika virus. There have been a number of obstacles and barriers in respect of access to medicines – including the high prices caused by monopolies, and the absence of appropriate treatments for neglected diseases.

The speakers reviewed the proposed solutions for remedying the policy incoherence between intellectual property, public health, and international law. This forum considered such issues as health research and development; patent law and compulsory licensing; public sector licensing; open access and open innovation; international trade; bioethics, privacy, and human rights. The future possible implementation of the United Nations Secretary-General's High Level Panel on Access to Medicines – both at an international level and by national governments were discussed.

Australian Media Law – the Year in Review (Convenor)







Rimmer says there is a raging debate in Australia about the regulation of e-cigarettes. He says Health Minister Greg Hunt has emphasised that he is steadfast in his opposition to e-cigarettes but Trent Zimmerman and Tim Wilson have been pushing for e-cigarette deregulation. He adds the World Health Organization has been very concerned e-cigarettes have been promoted by big tobacco as an alternative to cigarettes. Rimmer says the ACCC has taken action against many cigarette companies for making misleading health claims. He says many things are happening in other countries that might signal a shift towards the treatment of tobacco and cigarettes in Southeast Asia. Feeney notes Rimmer will be presenting a talk about tobacco through the Asia Pacific.

Pre-recorded interview with Dr Matthew Rimmer, Professor of Intellectual Property and Innovation Law, QUT, regarding the regulation into 3D printing. Webber reports 3D printed weapons are prompting authorities to discuss legislation regarding the printer's use. Rimmer says there are concerns 3D printed guns could have a disastrous effect on the community, citing such weapons can pass through metal detectors; however, there are some who say such concerns are overblown. He mentions Defense Distributed, a US company that distributes blueprints for 3D printing guns, has been challenged in court regarding its work with the government winning the lawsuit and appeals. Rimmer then says Australia had a Parliamentary inquiry into minimising gun violence in the country with one of its recommendations being the regulation of 3D printed weapons. He enumerates court cases in Australia involving 3D printed guns.

Interview with Qld University of Technology Professor Matthew Rimmer. Myriad Genetics is expected to fight back against the decision in a number of ways, Rimmer says. The biotechnology company could lobby Parliament to overturn the law. However, he notes the new Australian Prime Minister Malcolm Turnbull "has expressed his concern about gene patents, previously." Myriad could invoke an investor-state dispute settlement claim over the ruling, as did tobacco firms regarding Australia's 2011 law requiring the plain packaging of tobacco products. Although Rimmer doubts such moves would prove successful, he says "the biotechnology industry will no doubt push for a change of the rules in respect of patentable subject matter under secretive regional agreements such as the Trans-Pacific Partnership."
