## **TEACHING EXPERIENCE**

I have extensive experience teaching many economics, quantitative and business-related subjects at both graduate (including MBA) and undergraduate levels. I have taught at universities in Australia, the United States, Canada, Germany and South Korea; I have taught courses in Economics Departments, Business Schools, in a College of Engineering as well as an Industrial and Labor Relations School. In every place that I have taught where students "grade" their teachers, I have received excellent teaching evaluations. In 2003, I was awarded the inaugural teaching prize by the Bond Business Students Association for International Trade Policy. I have taught in a large number of subjects, including international trade, industry policy, labour economics, macroeconomics, econometrics and statistics and microeconomics.

## **AREAS OF RESEARCH FOCUS**

My research interests primarily have to do with the analysis of labour markets and international trade. Research on the effects of globalisation on labour markets is the underlying theme of much of my research. The last few years have also afforded me the opportunity to travel to Japan. So, some of my research therefore focuses on various aspects of the Japanese economy, e.g., my work on Japanese foreign direct investment.

Overall, my current research plans are stimulated by the benefits of combining microeconomic foundations of the labour market, econometric techniques and broad macroeconomic and policy concerns. Specific areas of research:

- The labour market consequences of trade and foreign investment liberalisation, immigration and 'globalisation'
- The impact of structural adjustments, trade reforms and educational policies on income distribution
- The political economy of economic reform (specifically, labour market policies)
- Structural change and the Japanese firm
- Labour market policies in Japan
- Economics of compensation and labour market adjustment; structure of compensation and corporate governance issues; labour market incentives and labour market programmes.
