SUMMARY

Rosita Dellios is Associate Professor of International Relations. She teaches *Chinese Defence Policy*, *Strategic China*, and *Prospects for Global Politics* to undergraduates, and *Chinese Strategic Thought and Practice*, *China and East Asia*, *Trends for the International Future*, and *Concepts of World Governance* to postgraduate students. She has supervised three PhD students who graduated in recent years and is currently supervising two. In 2007 she received the Bond University Vice Chancellor's Quality Award for Postgraduate Supervision. She also received VC's research grants in 2007 and 2008.

As of 2011, Rosita Dellios has published one book on China's defence; co-edited a book on Confucian humanism; published 19 book chapters, 12 journal articles (some co-authored); and presented numerous conference papers. She is interested in the philosophical basis of Chinese strategic thought in the 21st century and its evolving military doctrine.
