## § 1.8 Classification of Contracts

**Contracts have been classified in various ways for different purposes. Some of these classifications will be discussed here briefly.**

### ***(b) Void, Voidable and Unenforceable Contracts***

This power to avoid or ratify is sometimes given to a minor and to persons who have been induced to enter contracts by undue influence, fraud, mistake or duress.<sup>8</sup>
