What are the main types of requests that we may want to purchase rather than borrow?

- Books
 - New titles
 - Subject-specific
 - Previously requested
 - Overseas dissertations
- Articles
 - When it's cheaper to buy than pay copyright plus lending fees
 - When articles are unavailable through traditional means

- To borrow once, we pay \$17.50
- To borrow twice, we pay \$35.00
- To buy, we pay \$12.00 +\$3.00 S&H
- \$17.50 15.00 = \$2.50 SAVINGS
- The book sale is an option
- Students could create brief records to place items on reserve
- Consider acquisitions and cataloging costs if we keep it

- ILL purchases via Amazon
- ILL adds record using OCLC Connexion
- ILL places a hold in our ILS
- ILL updates ILLiad



Purchase via Amazon

amazon.com.

- Login with the ILL e-mail username and password
- Select the Lib Tch Svs Account
- Place the item in the cart
- Select ILL as shipping location
- Submit the order
- Print 2 copies of the receipt from the ILL e-mail inbox, one to Purchasing Folder, one to Acquisitions








OCLC Connexion

- To add an order record to the OPAC, open the Connexion Client
- Click the icon to logon
- Click the "search WorldCat" icon; find the record
- CTRL Y (ONE TIME ONLY) to apply the 592 and 949 fields
- Go to field 949, after ep= type the price (no dollar sign) and click the save diskette icon
- Click the Export icon this will export the record to the OPAC and now reflect that we've ordered the item











Staff places a hold for ILL



ILLiad

- Make a note, ordered from Amazon for \$12.45
- Remove ILL # if previous
- Add *Amazon to the lending string
- Route request to Request Sent Document Provider (a custom queue)

- Upon Receipt
 - Property stamp the book
 - Check in via ILLiad and process as a typical receipt (due date one month)
- Upon Return
 - Item is routed to Selector, then Acquisitions if appropriate



Loan Workflow #2


- ILL uses e-mail routing to send the request to Acquisitions
- Alternatively or additionally, Acquisitions could monitor a queue of 2005 and newer requests (routed to a custom queue)
- Acquisitions staff does a rush order, catalogs, places hold
- Upon arrival, item is checked in at Acquisitions and user notified

The Alternative: saying no in a helpful way

- EXHAUSTED: You might request that the library acquire this item: http://vikat.pdx.edu/acquire/
- TOO NEW: This item was too recently published for circulating copies to be available for ILL. You could re-request in a few months or recommend that the library acquire this item: http://vikat.pdx.edu/acquire/

Article Workflow . . .

- ILLiad makes it easy to check Copyright costs.
- When we're about to exceed 5
 articles from the same journal
 published within the most recent 5
 years, and we're about to pay, we
 have the opportunity to decide to
 - FIRST look for free sources
 - buy outright from publishers, rather than pay copyright royalties and lending fees (the issue or the article)





With situational exceptions, none borrow textbooks via ILL. Half deflect requests using a bookstore-provided spreadsheet.

Does your library use ALIBRIS or other sources?






An anecdote

- You're in your locally owned video store, and the movie you planned to rent is on sale for \$2.99!
- The DVD rental cost is \$3.99
- Do you buy it or borrow it?
- In the future, perhaps it will make more sense for libraries to buy when it is cheaper than borrowing, even if the item does not match collection development parameters.
- Criteria or No Criteria, that may be the new question . . .


In a nutshell

- Borrowing a book for \$17.50 when it costs less to buy it isn't economically viable
- Borrowing the same book over and over is often more costly than buying it once
- Costs to buy articles directly from publishers are often lower than copyright royalty fees and lender fees



Customization: textbook routing

Customization: Amazon price-grabber

- Mike Flakus, Programmer Analyst Extraordinaire, wrote the Java script
- If an ISBN is in the URL of requests imported from WorldCat, the ISBN is used to look up the Amazon price
- The price is imported into the notes field of the ILLiad request
- If there's no ISBN or no Amazon price can be found, nothing is entered in the notes field






Some Positive Results

- We fill more requests, and we do it faster
- Copyright costs remain low
- After sharing the "Most Requested Journals" canned report, and the "New and Improved Copyright Report," Acquisitions folks appended the "Most Requested Journals" XLS with subscription costs

Some Sticky Wickets

- ePub ahead of print articles, embargos
- Online-only journals must buy or cancel
- Time involved in record-keeping
- More handling, mediation
- Collection development criteria thwarts some requests, example:
 - Wired for greed: the shocking truth about America's electric utilities
 - Author: Seeber, Joe.
 - Date: 2005
 - Publisher: iUniverse, Inc.
 - ISBN: 059535744X
 - OCLC#: 86081843
 - \$13.95 on Amazon.com
 - Non-circulating via ILL, but because this is considered a "Vanity Press," we canceled this request



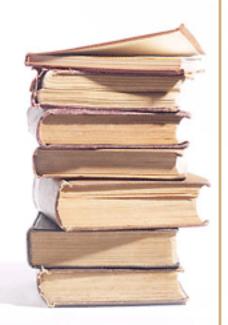




- Consider Routing Rules in ILLiad
 - Recently published books queue
 - Pre-1923 books queue to identify free public domain works on the web
 - Route based on a word to grow an area (nanotechnology)?
 - Route based on table of past requests (multiple requests for same title or ISBN)
 - Textbook requests based on ISBN or title
- Be excited to share what you know
 - Copyright costs, Subscription costs

- Be willing to learn and teach others (we're all in this together!)
 - ILS
 - ILLiad

- Think in terms of an ongoing conversation



- Get the Visa into ILL staff's hands
- Start small make one adjustment
- Be flexible



Possible Future workflows

- Extend use of document suppliers NTI, CAI, TGA, BRI, ALBRS, new vendors?
- Pilot ALBRS, pre-determined maxcost
- Forge more license agreements
 - Netflix or <u>www.facets.org</u>
 - eBooks (Safari)
 - Digital Dissertations (UMI)
- Borrow eBooks from CISTI
 - From the CISTI Catalogue, click on "<u>MyiLibrary</u> <u>eBook Loans</u>"
- Buy articles when <\$20
- Exchange eBooks with vendors (trade)
- Buy books when less than the cost to borrow. After buying a book, you don't have to keep it! You saved money already, and there are no return shipping fees.
- More automated purchasing (ILLiad talks to Gobi3, or other vendors)
