Annie Reid MLIS has been a Faculty Librarian and University Archivist at Dominican since 2007. In addition to her reference, instruction and liaison librarianship she manages the accession, preservation, outreach and curation in the University Archives Department. She is also responsible for the historical exhibits featured in the display cases in Edgehill Mansion. University Archives supports the preservation of Dominican's cultural memory by maintaining the many materials related to the unique traditions and everyday business of the University. Some of these materials include yearbooks dating

back to 1916, historical photograph collections and Board of Trustee reports.

Reid, a certified archivist, got her start in archives and librarianship at the Lucasfilm companies where she worked in the game division archives, film archives and research library.

Born and raised in San Francisco and Marin, Reid received her bachelor of science degree in physics from the University of Oregon. Making a small leap from the study of organizing the universe to the study of organizing information, coupled with a developing love of teaching and research, convinced Reid to pursue a master's degree in library and information science with a specialization in archival studies from San Jose State University.
