José María Domínguez is a native of Chihuahua, México. He has performed in numerous UTEP Operas, Chorale concerts, and sang with El Paso Chorale and Orchestra and performed numerous Zarzuelas here in El Paso.

Olga Montes is a graduate from Utep and has performed several zarzuelas and Operas here in El Paso, Juárez and Chihuahua. She's currently a member of El Paso Chamber Choir and El Paso Opera.

Dominic Dousa, a native of Rochester, Minnesota, joined the faculty of the University of Texas at El Paso Department of Music in August of 2004. He holds degrees in music from Ball State, Central Michigan University, and Harvard University (A.B. summa cum laude) and in statistics from Iowa State University. He also has studied composition in Prague. Dr. Dousa's compositions have been presented at conferences, festivals, and performing venues in the U.S., Canada, Mexico, Peru, China, the Czech Republic, and Finland. Two of Dousa's song cycles, *With a Song in My Heart* and *Six Songs on the Poetry of Langston Hughes*, have been recorded by baritone Gerald J. Blanchard (with Dousa at the piano) and released on the CD "*With a Song in My Heart*" by Blue Griffin Recording. Currently, Dousa is Composer-in-Residence for the El Paso Symphony Youth Orchestras.
