### **Data Analysis**

- Inductive coding techniques were utilized to analyze the data.
- The markers feature in Morae was used to highlight common themes
- Recordings were separated by Task using Morae to identify sections of the study
- Recordings were divided up among the group and reviewed and coded by two group members


# Findings

DePaul's original subject research guide template was not optimal for any particular user group, and was instead confusing for many.






- 1) What is the **overall purpose** of the guides?






### **Trends: Too Many Choices**

"Sometimes I feel like there's a little too much going on."

"I feel like there's so many [article databases] I wouldn't know what to choose."



#### **Article Databases**

Use databases to search for articles related to your topic:

#### PsycInfo

Indexes journals, dissertations, books and book chapters in all areas of psychology. Many full-text articles; some articles have abstracts only.

Dates Covered: 1887-present

#### PsycArticles

Provides full-text access to many of the journals indexed in Psycinfo, including the ability to search within full-text of the articles.

Dates Covered: 1894-Present

#### PILOTS

This database is an electronic index to the worldwide literature on PTSD and other mental health consequences of exposure to traumatic events.

#### PubMed

Indexes biomedical journals from MEDLINE and additional life science journals. Also links to molecular biology databases of DNA/protein sequences and 3-D structure data.

Dates Covered: 1966-present

#### ScienceDirect

Full text articles for well over 1,000 journals in science, health and the social sciences.

Dates Covered: 1996-present

#### Social Sciences Citation Index

Indexes references lists in social science journals. Recommended for advanced research on where authors and articles have been cited.

Dates Covered: 1975-present


#### · Health Source: Nursing/Academic Edition

Indexes scholarly journals in many medical disciplines; with full text.

Dates Covered: 1984-present

"It's just sort of an informational box that doesn't serve much purpose."




#### Go Beyond Wikipedia!





- Congress.gov is the official website for U.S. federal legislative information. The site provides access to accurate, timely, and complete legislative information for Members of Congress, legislative agencies, and the public. It is presented by the Library of Congress (LOC) using data from the Office of the Clerk of the U.S. House of Representatives, the Office of the Secretary of the Senate, the Government Publishing Office, Congressional Budget Office, and the LOC's Congressional Research Service.




