INTERACTIVE DATA PROJECT

DIGITAL REFUGE: At digitalrefuge.berkeley.edu, we translate, code, map and chart over 6,000 interviews with refugees, and over 10,000 facebook posts from Arabic and Farsi refugee sites, to contrast the official narrative of the European refugee crisis, with the refugee crisis seen from the perspective of displaced persons themselves. To complete digital refuge, I led a team of 18 Berkeley and Davis staff and students and was supported by CITRIS and Carnegie grants.
